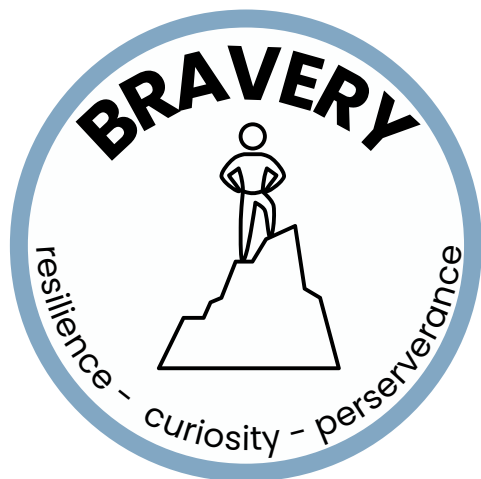

How did Room 10 successfully run their annual market?

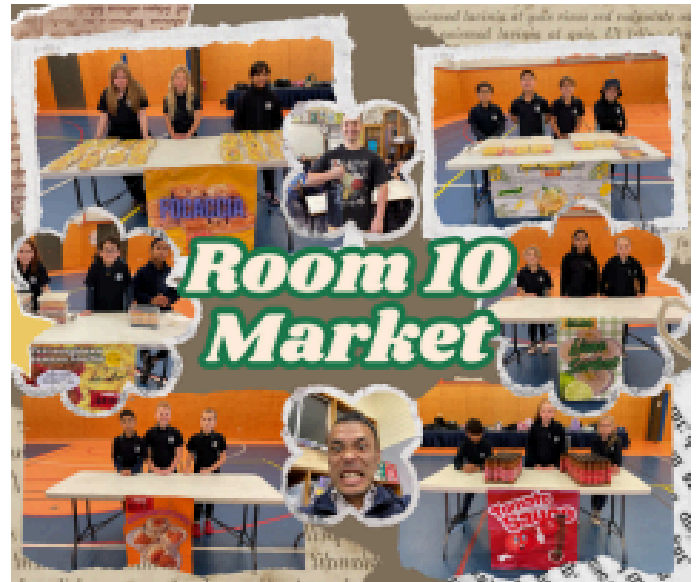
